

Curriculum Vitae – Mr. Amine REMINI

President of the Algerian Hydrocarbon Regulatory Authority (ARH)

Amine Remini, born on July 4, 1983, is an Algerian energy sector expert. He is married and the father of two children. He currently serves as President of the Executive Board of the National Agency for the Control and Regulation of Hydrocarbon Activities (ARH), a position he has held since July 30, 2025.

Mr. Remini holds a Master's degree in Management and a Bachelor's degree in Applied Economics from the University of Algiers. His strong academic background is reinforced by numerous international certifications in strategic management in exploration and production (E&P), economic evaluation of oil and gas projects, petroleum taxation, and international contract negotiation.

With over 15 years of experience in the hydrocarbon sector, he has held increasingly senior positions, including Director General of Hydrocarbons at the Ministry of Energy, Director of Hydrocarbon Development, and various strategic roles within the National Agency for the Valorization of Hydrocarbon Resources (ALNAFT), where he served as Director of Economic Studies and Head of the Economic Evaluation Department.

His areas of expertise cover a wide range of topics, including management, strategy, petroleum economics, taxation, field development planning, regulation of hydrocarbon activities, negotiation of petroleum contracts, and gas marketing, as well as cross-cutting topics such as fertilizers and seawater desalination.

Since 2024, Mr. Amine Remini has been serving as a member of the Executive Board of the African Petroleum Producers Organization (APPO), where he also holds the position of Chairman of the Long-Term Strategy (LTS) Committee. In the same year, he was appointed Chairman of the National Committee for Large-Scale Hydrocarbon Development, as well as Chairman of the Sectoral Committee tasked with formulating a national strategy for CO₂ capture, transport, utilization, and sequestration in the hydrocarbon sector. Since 2021, he has also been coordinating the work of the Interministerial Committee for the development of Algeria's national fertilizer industry. In addition to these roles, he is an active member of several other high-level strategic committees involved in shaping the national energy policy.
